Art Parley is an artist collective from Sue Jeong Ka and Melissa Liu. The most recent version of "Round Robin" took place during a six-week residency in Seward Park. Partners including Queens Museum, Lower Manhattan Council, Seward Park Conservancy and Immigrant Social Services.

More about Round Robin:

THE NEWSPAPER AND PROGRAMS ARE MEANT TO CENTER THOSE WHO LIVE IN THE NEIGHBORHOODS SURROUNDING THE PARK (CHINATOWN, LOWER EAST SIDE, AND TWO BRIDGES) AND THOSE WHO **IDENTIFY AS** IMMIGRANTS. ROUND ROBIN HAS BEEN A COLLABORATIVE FORUM TO BUILD SHARED CONVERSATION SPACES THROUGH CREATIVE FORMS OF EXPRESSION, ARTMAKING, AND SOCIAL GATHERINGS IN THE LES/TWO BRIDGES/CHINATOWN NEIGHBORHOODS. LOCAL RESIDENTS AND IMMIGRANTS OF ALL AGES ARE INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN A MULTILINGUAL SPACE AT SEWARD PARK WITH TRANSLATION AND INTERPRETATION IN CHINESE DIALECTS, ENGLISH, AND SPANISH, ALLOWING FOR CONNECTIONS AND EXCHANGE BEYOND LINGUISTIC AND CULTURAL BARRIERS.
